

So much so that our existence depends on this artificial environment,

just like our ancestors depended on the natural environment.

And that's how the techniques by which they "desacralized" nature in turn finds itself *unconsciously* sacralized.

The drama of 'modern man' is precisely that he is unconscious of sacralizing anything due to the fact that his critical mind is anesthetized by appetites for comfort and/or power.

Faced with climate change, one often hears "it will soon be too late".

Or, "we are charging into the wall".

But multiply these statements and, alas it is akin to indulging in a form of utopia.

Our planet is polluted because our minds themselves are.
But, as ecologists are multiplying to protect the environment, relatively few
people care about the health of the soul.

It is only techno criticism that identifies the sacred transferred to the technique at a projection of the unconscious.

Those believing in technology have indeed succeeded in spreading an exclusively objectivist vision of the world, thus vindicating Georges Bernanos, who defined modernity as "a conspiracy against all forms of inner life", and Jacques Ellul for whom "we live in the religion of the fact".

I express this aporia in this *contemporary art* pastiche, the official art of the technician system because it is eminently self-referential.

This anti-mandala features a universe above ground and closed.

Horizontal lines (which, by definition, do not intersect)

refer to a system that excludes any contradiction:

the dialectical exercise has become strictly impossible there
due to the fact that in its center, a real black hole, 'engulfs'
de facto any bright idea that would dare to challenge it.

The only dream of escape that the technical system offers us is the colonization of Mars and distant planets.

This headlong rush results from an eradication of critical thinking, what Hannah Arendt calls "the Emptiness of Thought".

In just a few decades, "information highways" have obliterated two thousand years of Christianity.

More precisely, the power of algorithmic came to crush *non-power* as symbolized by the incarnation of a god in a stable - between the ox and the donkey.

Christians played i the role of the consenting victim in this episode.

Just as, under Constantine, they bowed to the power
of the Leviathan (Jacques Ellul, *The Subversion of Christianity*),
they now conform to that of cables, electromagnetic waves and
silicon components, and artifacts they describe as *intelligent*.

Like millions of atheists, they saw in "technology" (as they call it) a harmless set of means neither-good-nor-bad because everything-depends-on-the-use-of-it.

And like millions of atheists, from whom they do not differ because they have made their bourgeois moral bland (the so-called "Christian values"), they have lost all lucidity by naively believing that the technique is "neutral".

Sheep of Christ become Sheep of Panurge*, they no longer have their eyes to cry when they realize that the tech billionaire bosses and their political backers dispossess them a little more each day of their freedom.

Humanism can be conceptualized in many ways. From the Dalaï Lama to any dictator, everyone is "humanist"!

One may wonder then, why such consensual wisdom has given rise to such a chaotic world?


The image that usually serves as an emblem (*The Man of Vitruvius*, a small drawing by Leonardo da Vinci) provides an answer to this question; at least to those who know how to see it.

The man pictured here is virile, a downright warrior, and his eight members (inscribed at the same time in a square, symbol of rationality, and in a circle, symbol of universality) are tentacular.

The center of the circle corresponds to the umbilicus. Thus, I dare to associate humanism with navality. That is, 'man' presents himself as 'the measure of all things' because his ego allows absolutely everything - the worst as well as the best.

It pleases me then to respond with brushes to put "things" in the place I give them.

I first see in them an infinite variety of colors. I write 'my' man in a mandala structure and make her face androgynous, a reference to my *anima*. And, just above, I place an arc of a circle open to the top, a fragment of a circle located largely outside the visual field in accordance with the idea that I have of the Most High, its creator.


Jung died two months after mankind's first foray around the Earth. Since then, and as he feared, technology has taken hold in the lives and imaginations of humans, a preponderant place.

In scientific circles, the words "soul", "shadow", and even "symbol" are viewed as the vestiges of another age; the psyche is studied from a narrowly materialistic angle ("the functioning of the brain"). And thought is no longer defined as anything other than "a flow of information", which then serves as models for the operation of computers.

I would have absolutely nothing to say against the "NBIC convergence" (Nanotechnologies, Biotechnology, Computer Science and Cognitive Sciences) if it did not convey a formidable ideology and did not present itself as an exclusive way of approaching the psyche; "exclusive" because it, de facto, excludes any spiritual approach. And I find it tragic that, nourished by this ideology, most of my peers end up believing (that's the exact term) in an "artificial intelligence".

In this context, it is difficult to individuate oneself, "to become an individual", and increasingly utopian to want to study interiority (the unconscious) without making exteriority (the technical system) an object of study.

This approach seems to me to be just as utopian as the opposite approach, which is now dominant. That is why I am calling for a dialectic: which takes into consideration both poles at the same time (and in equal terms).

Without appeal, technology condemns and dismisses ethics. on media and social networks, cognitive biases consecrate the victory of opinion over criticism. Populism, herd instincts, and conspiracy theories are given free rein.

And predators, hackers, and others pony-up to dictators.

If the reason of the strongest has become by far the best, it is because the "search for maximum efficiency in all things", to use Ellul's definition, has dismissed all the values of the past. These include "liberty-equality-fraternity" and the "Universal Declaration of Human Rights"... to the "Ten Commandments". Thus, the peoples who were genocidal yesterday are turning into genocidaires today.

The mother of all ideologies, the technical ideology, is more so because it is invisible and active from the unconscious. And if in my country it only alienates consciences, in others, it tortures and murders. In any case, and to use jargon that is in fashion - it is the same software that is activated.
